### NOTIFICATION OF CONFIRMED COVID-19 CASE ON CAMPUS

On Wednesday, September 23<sup>rd</sup> at 4:30 pm, Smyer ISD administration was notified that an individual at Smyer Elementary School was lab confirmed to have COVID-19. In keeping with Smyer ISD practices to respond to COVID-19, we are notifying all stakeholders that the individual was last on campus Wednesday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>. Due to privacy requirements, we will not be releasing the name of the individual or details that may identify him or her. The COVID positive individual is currently self-quarantining and will complete all required COVID return to school protocols before returning to campus.

We are working with the Texas Department of State Health Services Region 1 on this matter. All staff and students that potentially came into close contact with the infected individual have already been notified. As always, Smyer ISD facilities are constantly being cleaned and disinfected. All District employees and students are instructed to continue to follow CDC guidelines and recommendations by wearing masks and practicing social distancing.

We adhere to the Texas Education Agency's (TEA) definition of COVID-19 close contact: In general, close contact is defined as: a. being directly exposed to infectious secretions (e.g., being coughed on); b. being within 6 feet for a cumulative duration of 15 minutes; however, additional factors like case/contact masking, ventilation, and case symptomology may affect this determination. Either (a) or (b) defines close contact if it occurred during the infectious period of the case, defined as two days prior to symptoms onset or 10 days after symptom onset. In the case of asymptomatic individuals who are lab-confirmed with COVID-19, the infectious period is defined as two days prior to the confirming test and continuing for 10 days following the confirming of the lab test. Anyone who is determined to have been in close contact by the health department will be notified individually when contact tracing is concluded.

While we do not have reason to believe that those who were not in close contact with the infected individual have reason to be concerned, we ask that you, as always, watch for symptoms of COVID-19.

- Temperature of 100.0 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, sore throat, new uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing, diarrhea, chills, loss of taste or smell, significant muscle pain or ache.

If you or any member of your family does begin experiencing any of these symptoms in a way that is not typical, we encourage you to contact your physician. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to your child's campus principal or the superintendents office.
